This document contains detailed information about the application procedure for students wishing to take part in student mobility for studies within 2025 Project in **2026-2027 Academic Year (Fall/Spring/Full Academic Year)**

Students may submit their applications after checking through the host institutions who signed an agreement with their relevant Departments/Programs.

**⚠ It is the student's responsibility to submit the right application.**

A list of Partner Universities having an Erasmus Inter-Institutional Agreement with Üsküdar University can be found on [our website](#).

During the new project term, some Inter-Institutional Agreements may not be renewed. Thus, the Partner Institutions might change each year.

It is the sole responsibility of the student to submit the application correctly and upload the relevant documents to the system completely and in the correct format.



**⚠ IMPORTANT NOTE:** Students must be an **ACTIVE** student while they are applying and participating in the mobility program. Otherwise, mobility will be cancelled. Students are also responsible for keeping track of important announcements posted on the [Erasmus Announcement Page](#) and delivered to student mail inboxes.

## APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS / ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

### Who is eligible to apply?

- Applicants must be **full-time** students, except Preparatory School.
- Minimum GPA of 2.20/4.00 for undergraduate/bachelor students who are going to apply for Erasmus+ Study Mobility
- Minimum GPA of 2.50/4.00 for graduate/master's degree/PhD students who are going to apply for Erasmus+ Study Mobility
- Applicants must take Erasmus English Proficiency Exam or obtain a valid English language Score within 2 years.
- All completed application documents must be submitted to the [application system](#) until **11.03.2026**.

**📌 Note:** The fact that you have failed or failed courses does not prevent you from applying for Erasmus.

\*Freshmen - 1st year undergraduate/bachelor students can apply with high school diploma minimum grade. (75/100)

## 1. MOBILITY QUOTAS

The mobility quotas have been determined according to the accepted mobility number by National Agency. The allocated mobility number has been proportioned regarding the student number of institute.

The distribution of extra quotas or remaining empty places will be overseen by the Erasmus+ Coordinatorship. The number of the bilateral contracts, the performance of relevant department/institute, the candidate's score, past mobilities, the balance of gender, etc. will be considered when extra funds and quotas have been shared.

\*The above numbers are indicative and may be subject to change. Mobility quotas are determined based on the quotas allocated by the National Agency and the faculty-based participation rates of the last three academic years. Following the application period, the announced quotas may be revised and redistributed by the Erasmus+ Coordinatorship depending on the number of applications and available capacity.

## 1. APPLICATION PROCEDURE AND NECESSARY DOCUMENTS

**Applications will be made through the online application portal between 10.02.2026 to 11.03.2026.**

Erasmus+ Study Mobility applications will be made through "[turnaportal.ua.gov.tr](https://turnaportal.ua.gov.tr)" The following document is required:

**📌 Transcript** (The transcript must have been taken during the open call for application and should include the grades of the last term. Transcript must be **e-signed or wet-signed** \***The document taken from OBS system is not valid.**

**📌 PLEASE PAY ATTENTION TO THE DETAILS BELOW BEFORE STATING THE UNIVERSITY PREFERENCE IN THE APPLICATION FORM**

- Make sure that you choose the right semester to participate in the mobility.
- Pre-research (city, accommodation, etc.) should be done in university preferences and a preference order should be made.
- The university's course compliance and language of instruction should be checked by our students. Not all institutions offer every course in English. You should examine the language requirements of the institutions before you go. For this reason, do not request a change of institution after the preferences.
- Placements will be made based on quotas and nomination dates. It may be that there is not enough quota. Nominations of students applying for two semesters can be accepted by the host institution for a single term.



### ⚠ IMPORTANT NOTES:

- Quotas defined under Erasmus+ inter-institutional agreements are agreement-based and are not guaranteed on a department basis. Even if department-level quota information is displayed during the application process, placements are made based on the total quota allocated within the relevant inter-institutional agreement.
- The selection and nomination of students by Üsküdar University do not constitute a guarantee of participation in the mobility activity, as the realization of the mobility is subject to the academic and administrative approval of the host institution. In cases of quota changes, insufficient quotas, or rejection by the host institution for any reason, **Üsküdar University and its Erasmus+ Office shall bear no responsibility or liability.**
- Within the scope of the Erasmus+ Study Mobility Program, the mobility semester (fall or spring) determined during the application and placement process shall be binding. Students are not permitted to request a change of mobility semester unless a force majeure situation applies. Force majeure refers to unforeseeable, exceptional, and duly documented circumstances beyond the student's control, including but not limited to visa refusal by the competent authorities despite timely and complete application, or serious and documented health conditions that make it impossible for the student to participate in the mobility during the assigned semester. Such cases shall be assessed by Üsküdar University Erasmus+ Office in accordance with the relevant regulations and the provisions of the Erasmus+ Program Guide. Requests for semester changes that do not meet the criteria of force majeure **shall not be taken into consideration.**

📌 **Note:** You can check the compliance of the courses at the receiving institution with the help of your Erasmus Academic Coordinator. Erasmus Academic Coordinators list can be found on our website.

## 2. FOREIGN LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

Students should take the Erasmus English Proficiency Exam to be held by Üsküdar University Coordinatorship of Foreign Languages or upload a valid English language certificate within last **two** years issued by **TOEFL, PTE** or a valid English language certificate within last **five** years issued by **YDS, YÖKDİL** to the [system](#) **between February 10th and March 11th, 2026**. Students are also responsible for keeping track of important announcements posted on website and delivered to their inboxes.

**Students who wish to take the 2026 Erasmus English Proficiency Exam on 16th of March 2026, must select "I want to take the 2026 Erasmus English Proficiency Exam at my University." Applications from students who neither upload a valid English language exam score (TOEFL, YDS, YÖKDİL) nor select "I want to take the 2026 Erasmus English Proficiency Exam at my University" will be rejected.**

**⚠ ANY STUDENT WHO HAS NOT MARKED THIS BOX WILL NOT BE ABLE TO TAKE THE 2026 ERASMUS ENGLISH PROFICIENCY EXAM.**



**⚠ Only students who have applied for Erasmus+ this year can take 2026 Erasmus English Proficiency Exam.**

**📌 Students who will use previous Erasmus English Proficiency Exam Scores obtained within 2 years must upload to the application portal between February 10th and March 11th, 2026. These documents can be found from Foreign Languages Coordinatorship.**

The equivalency table and language requirements are prepared in accordance with the [Üsküdar University Coordinatorship of Foreign Languages Preparatory School Rules and Regulations](#).

**⚠ Important Notes:**

- Students should take the Erasmus English Proficiency Exam to be administered by Üsküdar University Coordinatorship of Foreign Languages or upload a valid English language certificate within last two years issued by TOEFL, PTE and within the last five years issued by YDS, YÖKDİL to the application system when the applications are started.
- Students who took the Erasmus English Proficiency Exam held by the Foreign Languages Coordinatorship Office within the last 2 years can apply Erasmus Mobility with their exam results if they wish.
- The student's English Proficiency Exam Result with the highest score will be taken into consideration in the Erasmus Application Evaluation.
- Previous Erasmus English exam scores of students who have taken the Erasmus English exam during their undergraduate period, but who are currently in their master's degree or have changed their department to another department will not be accepted.
- The preparatory exam scores that you had before will not be accepted.



#### 4. ASSESSMENT PROCESS

Erasmus Score is calculated as follows: **50% of GPA + 50% of Erasmus English Proficiency Exam score**. Students will be ranked following their Erasmus Score based on undergraduate/graduate/vocational school programs.

While calculating Erasmus Score, the following points will be added to or deducted from the overall score under the applicant's status.

#### 5. ANNOUNCEMENT PROCESS

Announcement process consists of four stages:

1. **Erasmus English Proficiency Exam:** Announcement of the Erasmus English Proficiency Exam Results administered by Coordinatorship of Foreign Languages.
  2. **Erasmus+ Score:** Erasmus Score is calculated and announced following the assessment.
  3. **Placement:** In accordance with their Erasmus+ Scores, students are placed in partner institutions.
  4. **Erasmus+ Grant:** Following the announcement of the grant amounts allocated to universities by the National Agency, and the approval of intra-institutional budgeting, further details on grants are released.
- Students are required to receive acceptance letters from the host institution as well to participate in Erasmus+ mobility.
  - While any procedure regarding going abroad, finding accommodation abroad, passport and visa procedures are principally students' responsibility, Erasmus+ Coordinatorship may provide support for Partner University and Üsküdar University.

#### 6. ERASMUS GRANTS

The countries where student mobility activities can be carried out are divided into 3 groups according to their standard of living levels and monthly tuition and internship grants have been determined for the country groups. The country groups and the monthly grant amounts to be given to the students who will go to these countries are shown in the table below:

- Students are ranked in a descending order according to their Erasmus score. Grants will then be distributed to students according to the overall ranking.
  - Grants may not be allocated to each student.
  - Students are allowed to undertake Erasmus activity by their own financial means.
  - Monthly Erasmus rates are determined by the National Agency prior to the beginning of Academic Year in accordance with national priority and criteria.
  - The exact period of Erasmus activity is calculated based on the start/end dates specified in the certificate of participation.
  - The rate of grant is set by the European Commission for 27 EU member countries as shown in the table above. The amount of grant varies according to your destination country's cost of living and quality of life indexes.
  - Students shall receive grants only during their mobility period abroad. To use the allocated grant amount efficiently and meet all students' needs, the students will be offered a grant only for the period between the class start date and the end of final exams.
  - In case a student returns to his/her home country earlier than the specified end date of the exchange period, the student shall receive a grant only for the period the student stayed in the destination country. In case a student stays abroad longer than the specified end date of the mobility semester, the student shall not receive any additional grant for the extended period.
  - Üsküdar University Erasmus+ Coordinatorship may ask student to provide a copy of his/her passport for the determination of the period spent abroad if deemed necessary.
  - Students are ranked in a descending order according to their Erasmus score. Grants will then be distributed to students according to the overall ranking. The grant for study mobility can only be provided for 4 months (120 days).
- 📌 **Payments are made in two stages, with 80% of the total grant going before and 20% upon return.**



## 7. ERASMUS GRANT DEDUCTION AFTER THE MOBILITY

- Staying for less than 4 months without a majeure force will result in a deduction from the remaining grant.
- If participants do not fill out the EU Survey Participant Report, a 20% cut will be imposed on grant allocated for the total mobility period.
- If participants fail to successfully complete/pass the 2/3 of the course credits set forth in the learning agreement, they shall not receive the second instalment payment (20% of the total grant amount).

## 8. TRAVEL SUPPORT CALCULATIONS

In order to support students' travel costs, the distance between the starting point of the mobility and the place where the activity takes place should be determined using the distance calculator provided by the European Commission and the travel grant should be calculated using the table below.

The grant equivalent in the table below of the kilometers in the [distance band calculator](#) is the round-trip amount and this amount is not multiplied by two.

As a general rule, participants are expected to travel by low-emission transport for distances for under 500 kilometers. Green travel is the use of public transport with low carbon emissions. The use of buses, trains, shared cars are included in the scope of green travel. In order to receive green travel support, green travel must be used on the way there and back and more than half of the entire trip must be made using green vehicles.

Where necessary, individual support grants can be awarded for travel time before and after the activity, with a maximum of two days for travel days and a maximum of six days if green travel is used.

Students who choose green travel will receive a one-time green travel support of 50 Euros. In addition, if necessary, an individual support grant for travel is provided for the number of days, up to a maximum of four days.

**⚠️ Green Travel Support and Travel Support is for students who are awarded with a grant.**

## 9. INCLUSION SUPPORT

### (Additional Grant Support)

Additional Grant Support will be provided to disadvantaged participants in addition to the grant to which they are entitled. In order to be eligible for the grant, a disadvantaged participant is defined as an individual who is economically and socially disadvantaged and meets the following subcategories.

1. Those who are subject to Law No. 2828 (those who have a protection, care or shelter decision by the Ministry of Family and Social Services in accordance with Law No. 2828)
2. Students for whom a protection, care or accommodation decision has been taken within the scope of Child Protection Law No. 5395
3. Those who are granted orphan/death pension
4. Spouses and children of martyrs/veterans and veterans themselves
5. Those who have been granted a needy pension to themselves or their family (it is sufficient to submit a document proving that the student has received financial support from municipalities, public institutions and organizations (Ministries, Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundations, General Directorate of Foundations, General Directorate of Foundations, Red Crescent, AFAD, etc.) at the time of Erasmus application
6. People with Disabilities
7. Students whose one of their parents or guardian receives a disabled or needy pension within the scope of the Law No. 2022 dated 01.07.1976 on the Granting of Monthly Allowance to Needy, Powerless and Destitute Turkish Citizens and Disabled and Needy Turkish Citizens who have reached the age of 65 and students who receive a disabled or needy pension



- Those who themselves or their 1st degree relatives receive disaster victim support from AFAD.

Credit and Dormitories Institution scholarships and similar scholarships, other grants, aids and scholarships in the form of merit scholarships, one-time aids are not accepted within the scope of this financial aid.

Additional Grant Support will be provided in the following amounts according to the type of mobility to the students who meet the above scope, upon their request and provided that they document this situation.

Student mobility between 2-12 months	250.00 € Monthly
Short-term student mobility between 5-14 days	100.00 € in addition to the daily grant total
Short-term student between 15-30 days mobility	150.00 € in addition to the daily grant total

In case of any amendments in the Erasmus+ Program rules or National Agency regulations, the updated provisions shall apply.
